Signals was established as a film and video workshop in 1988. It has since developed into a centre for filmmaking and digital learning.

Signals aims to have a positive impact on peoples' lives by encouraging creativity, developing skills and raising aspirations through digital production and education. Signals seeks to increase understanding of film and digital arts and encourage participation. Signals also promotes diversity, creativity, experimentation and achievement in media arts, as well as working in partnership with other organisations.

Signals core value is that it breaks down social barriers. The creative digital environments can offer a non-threatening place for people to deal with all sorts of issues, from personal confidence to learning vital life skills and receiving training to raise career aspirations, whatever their age. Signals is also committed to work with all communities across the region.

Signals works with a number of clients to produce a wide range of media productions. Signals runs courses and outreach projects in Colchester and across the region. Approximately 80% of Signals work is with young people and children, many from disadvantaged backgrounds.

Signals is an established award-winning organisation that is recognised for its successful work with disadvantaged young people and children. Signals works directly with around 4,000 people per year, and its work is seen by thousands more around the world.
